PIR SAHEB PAGARA AND THE HUR MOVEMENT
AT NATIONAL DOCUMENTATION CENTRE, CABINET DIVISION
GOVERNMENT OF PAKISTAN, ISLAMABAD**

There are three kinds of materials at the NDC (Cabinet Division) on Pir Sahab Pagaro: (1) Photograph Holdings, (2) Microfilm Holdings. Other materials cover extensive areas of historical documents concerning the present lands of Pakistan: Sindh, Balochistan, Frontier, and the Punjab. Documents related with Sind include materials from before the days of Napier, gazetteers of Sind, Nawabshah, Parker, Khairpur state, repatriation of Sindhis from USSR and transfer of their money, Governor Reports of various years from 1937 to 1945, Sind Legislative Debates of various years including 1937-39, letters to Eastwick [1839-41] and other British persons in Sind [1819-1931], expedition of 1843, fortnightly reports on Bombay Presidency, arrangement of upbringing and education of wali-ahad of Khairpur State [1942], Bombay Confidential Proceedings 1921-30, Wellesley Papers, Correspondence regarding the agreement reached with Meer Ghulam Ali Hakim of Sind 1808-09; annual police reports for Sind 1869, 1871; settlement records of Shahbandar... 1891, letters of Praedee, suppression of local mutineers at Hyderabad and Shikarpur, the Sind Quran Act 1940, etc. In addition to these materials, there are a large number of documents of various aspects of Pir Pagaras and the Hurs in both Photocopy Holdings and Microfilm Holdings.

Brief contents: Shah Mardan Shah – Lucas – Bhurgri; Hur deportations beyond Sind, Khandala; difficulties due to cultural-linguistic differences; escape of Ghulam Nabi Shah; possible release of Hurs in the days of Lawrence; murder of Karimdad Junejo; Fatu Mari fight in settlement, Kassim Sanjrani blamed for the fight by the Police; Bharat-Vasi newspaper points out hardships of Hurs in Settlements [hika hura jee pukaar]; Mirpur Gazette advises Hurs to behave properly [so the Government gets no excuse to victimize them]; cuttings from newspapers favouring Hurs; Hurs escape from Pimpalgaon.

[Creating a situation/preparing ground against the Pir Sahab from 1928 to 1930] complaints and petitions from family members, neighbours and others suggesting that the young Pir is behaving like a tyrant. The authorities order subordinates to send in lists of police cases of theft, dacoities, and murders since 1923 from various districts to be ascribed to Pir Sahab. The reports pour in about loss of properties ranging from rupees 3 Jial Shah's letter to Mr. Bernard informing him of a serious situation he is in: how he wants Qadri [Deputy Collector] to give in writing that the Pir has said he would have Jial Shah killed – and how Qadri wants Jial Shah to put pressure on Ali Mohammad Rashdi to leave/divorce the woman he has married so Qadri can have her. Qadri's threats to Jial Shah, "If you get killed, they will blame the Pir for it". The letter reveals how the intriguers are involved in cooking up conspiracies and counter-conspiracies, wanting to kill one another, laying the blame on the readily available target – Pir Sahab Sibghatullah Shah. Fresh consignments of Hurs are being sent to Bijapur 'restriction of movement of Hurs to Bijapure' (April, 1930)

A B. Hannah, Assistant Secretary to Government sends him a report on Hurs – suggesting that Gidumal's note is on page 17 of that report. This report and this note are not in this file. The NDC file contains 10 pages, which are in fact three times repetitions of pages 2, 3, and 4, only three pages.
- File Mss Eur F208/14 extracts made by Lambrick from the fortnightly confidential letters between the Governor of Sind, Sir Hugh Dow, and the Viceroys (Lord Linlithgow and Lord Wavel, 1941 to 1945. It is supposed to be 71 pages.

- File Mss Eur F208/15 papers concerning the prosecution of the Pir for locking up his servant, and other alleged malpractices related with 1930 cases [of murder, confinement, and keeping arms and ammunition without license – three other cases were withdrawn. In IOL, the file is supposed to contain 270 pages/sheets. This file is to be read with Photograph Holdings file number S-191.
- File Mss Eur F208/16 File on the arrest and trial of the Pir, and the question of his successor; the correspondence March 1942 to June 1946. IOL original file is supposed to contain 264 A3 sheets.

Lambrick sets the scene for his drama 'Trial of Pir Sahab in Martial Law Court'. Original file was supposed to have contained 16 A-3 sheets.
